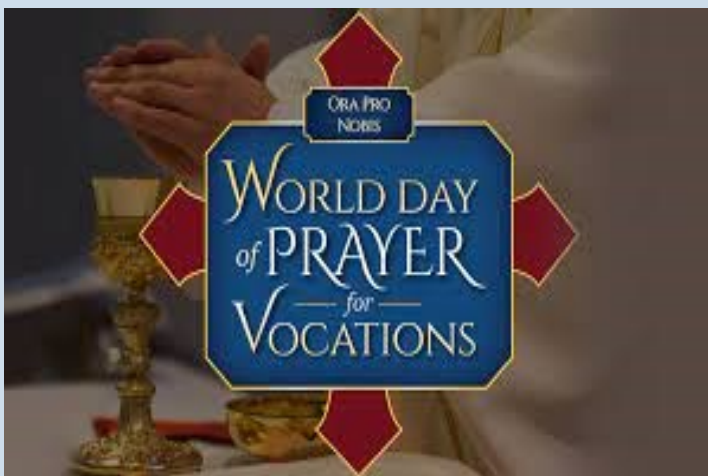

St. Paschal Baylón (1540-1592) was born in Spain to impoverished Catholic parents. He worked alongside his father as a shepherd from his childhood until his twenties. He often prayed while working in the fields, listening daily for the church bells that would ring at the elevation of the Eucharist at Mass to remind him to spend time with the Lord. He was known for his work ethic and honesty among his neighbors. He wanted to live the religious life from a young age. Baylón taught himself to read so he could pray the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin, a prayer popular in his time. He would give parts of his dinner away to those in need when it was brought to him as he was shepherding in the field. He also had great compassion for the sick. At 24, Baylón joined the Friars Minor. The Friars asked him if he wanted to be a priest, but he chose to be a brother instead. In this vocation he served his brothers in many ways, including as a chef, door man, gardener, and official beggar. As a Franciscan lay brother, he took a vow of poverty but remained generous to those poor who came begging at the monastery — to the point that the Order sometimes tried to limit his giving. St. Paschal found particular solace while praying before the Blessed Sacrament. His devotion to Christ in the Eucharist was tangible as he was known to spend most of his free time in adoration and would occasionally experience visions after all-night prayer. Because of this devotion, he is the Patron Saint of Eucharistic Congresses and Societies. He was also known for his spiritual council. People all over the region would visit him to talk about faith and life. St. Paschal Baylón, pray for us!

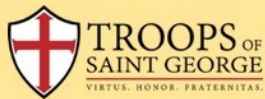
